# **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear parishioners and friends,

When I arrived at SFX two years ago, I could not have imagined what awaited all of us just a few months later. In the face of this pandemic, we have faced challenges and endured hardships -- personally, in our families, our workplaces, schools, and in our church. More than ever, we needed to come together to care for one another and to use our abilities to continue our mission to proclaim the gospel. It has not been an easy road. Many sacrifices were made along the way but that is the life of a follower of Jesus. I am grateful for the resiliency, resourcefulness, and generosity of this community. We've learned a great deal during this time – new ways to worship, to pray, to educate, and to connect – new ways to proclaim the good news. ### **Special Collections**

\$20,777 was contributed for special needs through designated second collections including the annual World Mission Sunday, Gospel of Life, and support of the Holy Land.

#### St. Vincent De Paul

\$73,000 was donated to support the SFX conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society including Fifth Sunday, Poor Box, and memorial donations. An additional \$30,000 in food donations was collected through the church collection boxes and food drives.

The conference provided the following assistance to local households:

- 1,850 food boxes were delivered benefitting 2,950 individuals
- 70 families received full or partial rental assistance
- 60 families received full or partial utility assistance
- 125 families received vouchers for furniture or household items.

### Charity & Development Appeal

The annual Charity & Development Appeal (CDA) supports more than seventy charities, ministries, and apostolates throughout the Diocese of Phoenix including social services, evangelization efforts, religious education, ministry formation, vocations, Catholic schools, under-resourced parishes and missions, and the liturgy including televised Mass. The CDA provides us with a way to support the church's mission beyond our walls. For the calendar year 2020, St. Francis Xavier contributed \$330,812.75 to the CDA. ## Diocesan Capital Campaign - Together Let us Go Forth

The *Together Let Us Go Forth* Campaign is a response in faith to the mission of the church to evangelize and make disciples (Mathew 28:19) right here in the diocese of Phoenix. To date, parishioners of St. Francis Xavier have pledged \$2.1 million to this campaign with \$1.7 million redeemed. A portion of the funds raised is returned to the parish to meet our needs.

Members of our pastoral staff were asked to look back on this very unusual year and reflect on the following questions:

Katrina Winn, our Youth Minister, noted how quickly our formation programs shifted to an online experience. Zoom meetings provided an unexpected opportunity to reach parents and siblings. Parent participation has remained strong with the return to in-person meetings.

Our Liturgy Director, Josh Condon appreciated the opportunity to look at the way we 'do ministry' with a fresh perspective and identify areas where we can do better. He felt a deeper appreciation for communal worship and is hopeful that our liturgies will inspire more people to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

The Novena of Grace was offered for the very first time during Lent. Junuee Castro (Ignatian Faith Formation) described it as a powerful opportunity for fellowship and to strengthen our hope. Plans for this year's Novena are already underway.


