Ministry Highlights

Ignited Family Faith Formation

In 2024–25, our Ignited Family Faith Formation program served 88 families —127 children, with 50 children receiving sacraments. One highlight was the smooth transition of 11 fifth graders into Edge, as they continued their second year of preparation and strengthened the bridge between children's and youth ministry. For the first time, Ignited, Edge, and Life Teen collaborated to provide a truly complete model of family faith formation, including adult faith opportunities for parents.

This year bore many fruits: six couples inquired about sacramental marriage, with three are now in the process of convalidation; two older children from program families came to serve as catechist aides; and several parents joined a parent committee representing our parish in the National Community of Catechetical Leaders (NCCL) family project with the Diocese of Phoenix.

Our families also led the first-ever All Saints Festival, an event organized and executed entirely by parents in the program, marking a milestone in parish life. Likewise, the Parish Posada drew close to 300 participants, bringing families and parishioners together in prayer and celebration.



The finance council advises the pastor on matters relating to the stewardship of the parish's financial resources. Members are appointed by the pastor.

Special Collections

\$7,359 was contributed to national and international needs through designated collections. Additional collections this year included \$15,732 to support the Heart of Jesus school in Peru through Cross Catholic Outreach and \$15,400 for educational programs through E3 Africa in Uganda.

St. Vincent De Paul

\$80,000 was donated to support the SFX conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, including Fifth Sunday, Poor Box, and memorial donations. An additional \$99,500 in food donations was collected through the church collection boxes and food drives.

The conference provided the following assistance to local households:

- 2,150 food boxes
- \$55,000 in full or partial rental assistance
- \$2,700 in full or partial utility assistance
- \$2,200 in vouchers for furniture or household items
- \$400 in bus passes
- \$600 for prescriptions

Charity & Development Appeal

The parish raised \$270,533 for the 2025 CDA exceeding our goal of \$224,517. Thirty percent raised over our goal is returned to the parish. We anticipate a rebate of \$13,805. Three hundred thirty-five (335) households contributed to this year's appeal which supports more than seventy charities, ministries, and apostolates throughout the Diocese of Phoenix. Notes & Details

Parish and SFXAA

Offertory and unrestricted gifts increased by 2% due to a 4% increase in in offertory contributions offset by a slight decrease in unrestricted gifts. A large unrestricted bequest was received in 2024 and a portion of the related proceeds was used to replace the Church's legacy HVAC system.

Church compensation and benefits increased by 15% due to staff salary increases of 4% along with increased healthcare and retirement costs.

Church operating expenses decreased by 15% due to lower repair and maintenance, security and Diocesan assessment costs offset by higher utility costs.

St Francis Xavier Athletic Association (SFXAA) is a volunteer organization founded in 1956 where young athletes may grow in respect and concern for others. It is open to all children in the local community. SFXAA operating expenses increased by 8% due to the continued growth of its baseball and soccer programs as well as an increase in its AMDG baseball and softball club teams.

The Church and SFXAA had a net loss of \$145,000 in 2025; however, after subtracting non-cash depreciation expense and unrealized gains on investments, the net loss was only \$49,000.

Bishop's (Diocesan) Assessment – Each parish in the diocese contributes a percentage of its ordinary income to support diocesan-wide offices and ministries. Large parishes such as SFX contribute approximately 12% annually.

Maintenance Fund – The maintenance fund is a vital source of revenue to care for our iconic church and facilities. This collection increased by 40% over the prior year. Parish School

Tuition, registration and fees increased by 4.3% primarily as a result of tuition rate increases of 6.0% offset by slight reductions in registration and other fees. Our School operated essentially at capacity in both 2025 and 2024 and had waiting lists in certain grades.

Compensation and benefits increased by 7% due to staff salary increases of 4% along with increased healthcare and retirement costs.

Operating expenses increased by 12% due to higher repair and maintenance, utility, insurance and security expenses.

Net fundraising income increased as a result of outstanding efforts by the School's development team and Parent's Association.

The School had a net loss of \$172,000 in 2025; however, after subtracting non-cash depreciation expense and unrealized gains on investment, the School generated net income off \$20,000.
